This applies at the level of the mutual aid districts as well. The geographic and topographical differences across Manitoba make the communication realities of each mutual aid district unique.

"Although each department is different, I have noticed some patterns." reports Kevin. "There are some issues that come up more than others when I am visiting a fire department."
